




A group of students from an elementary school are attending one of the most important competition between all the elementary schools in that area. And they had signed up for the competition because they will get a shiny trophy!








The competition had started and its their turn to perform. The drape opened and they were standing in a square formation. (They had four people each on one side.)




Later, during the chorus of the song, all of them had moved to the audience by two steps, this means that the square they had formed had moved. This is called translation.




During the second verse of their song, the entire square had rotated by 90 degrees around one student named Ashely. This is called rotation.



As the song was reaching its end, all the students had moved closer to each other, filling the one-person-gap between each of them. This means that the square's area had shrunken by a scale factor of 2. This is called dilation.
