


The One-Line maze of the Apocalypse


The destroyed

And it had created HUNDREDS of disasters




Caused by human, still

Jesse: This is the basic shape of this cave!


Karl: So... it's like a pentagon?

Jesse: There is a maze inside this cave hospital, AND there are emergency supply boxes in EVERY single tunnel.

Karl: You mean the supply hospital?

Then why don't we just go in here from one of the cave entrance and get out from another when we get enough supplies?

Jesse: No! The rules are:

1. go through the maze only ONE time
2. Get all the supplies (go through every tunnel)
3. Do not go through the cave entrance more than TWICE (one to exit one to enter)

Jesse, why can't we go through the same tunnel twice?

Same thing happens when you enter again after you've left the hospital...

And Jesse had the answer

Well, this "supply hospital" is quite different from those normal ones. If you go through a tunnel twice, a type of poisonous gas will be released.

Jesse pointed out the real problem, how are they going to get all the emergency supply boxes crossing each tunnel exactly once? Fortunately, Karl quickly came up with a solution.

I believe my teacher had taught me something like this before


We've learned it at a problem solving class, it was only meant to be a fun activity

Alright, lemme try this...






Of course, it's really simple.



Here is how you solve the maze!



first, here is the layout of the maze










Karl: It's simple, just use another route:




Jesse explained:

In the both starting tunnel, there are some obstacles.



(my parents used to use them as experiment pets or whatever)

The thing is, if we Jesse meet any of the obstacles (snake / beetle), we either going to be harmed or delay the time for you to recover your wound



(oh wow you remembered that!)
Karl okay, So we'll choose the path that's more likely to be empty :/

Karl thought about it for a few seconds, then he quickly pointed out the solution!

Path a:

Karl: here are the probability of us meeting the beetles:

X = no beetles
three possible outcomes: A, B, C

- possible outcomes:
- 1) (A, B, C) ← all beetles are active
 - 2) (A, B, X) ← only two beetles are active
 - 3) (A, X, C)
 - 4) (X, B, C)
 - 5) (A, X, X) ← only one beetle is active
 - 6) (X, B, X)
 - 7) (X, X, C)
 - 8) (X, X, X) → no beetles
- 8 outcomes

to meet zero beetles in tunnel @

Path b:

Karl: and here are the probability of us meeting the snakes:

X = no snakes
two possible outcomes: A, B

- possible outcomes:
- 1) (A, B) ← all snakes are active
 - 2) (A, X) ← only one snake is active
 - 3) (X, B)
 - 4) (X, X) → no snakes

4 outcomes
↓
1/4

25% to meet zero snakes in tunnel @

$25% > 12.5%$

(Karl: path b is a better way to go since there is bigger chance to meet zero obstacles.

Jesse was very pleased to hear the answer, and later, the two got into the cave right away.



Although everything was going well at the moment, Karl still got a bit suspicious for Jesse...

Jesse, how is your memory so good? Seriously!


You're right Karl! Tell me Jesse... there isn't any snakes around the supply box!





